TEST-OPTIONAL POLICY

Auburn offers a Test-Optional policy which gives applicants the choice to submit test scores for consideration. Here is a helpful chart that breaks down the requirements for admissions and scholarship consideration for a Traditional Applicant and a Test-Optional Applicant.

SCHOLARSHIP CONSIDERATION

ADMISSION APPLICATION CHECKLIST

- ☐ Complete application through Auburn University or the Common Application.
- ☐ Pay the \$50 application fee or submit documentation for fee waiver.
- ☐ Upload a copy high school transcript.
- ☐ Submit any standardized test scores. (Traditional Applicants)
- ☐ Minimum 3.6 high school GPA. (Test-Optional Applicants)
- ☐ Ensure all required documents are received by **December 1**.

SCHOLARSHIP CONSIDERATION CHECKLIST

- ☐ Accepted for admission to Auburn.
- ☐ Updated test scores for first-year students must be received by Auburn by **January 10**.
- ☐ Complete the scholarship application through the Auburn University Scholarship Opportunity Manager (AUSOM) by **February 1** for general and departmental scholarships.
- ☐ Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by **February 1** for need-based scholarships.

SCHOLARSHIP TYPES

AUTOMATIC CONSIDERATION

COMPETITIVE MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS

First-year students who are accepted for admission by mid-January receive automatic consideration. A scholarship application is not required. **However, applicants must submit test scores to be considered.**

SELECT NEED-BASED SCHOLARSHIPS

First-year students who are accepted for admission by mid-January and have a **completed Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** received by Auburn by February 1 receive automatic consideration. A scholarship application is not required.

REQUIRED SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

ACHIEVEMENT AND LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIPS

May be awarded as funding permits and are renewable for four years. Consideration is based on high school GPA and information provided on the scholarship application. For traditional applicants, standardized test score may also be considered. For test-optional applicants, the academic assessment during the evaluation for admission may also be considered. Priority consideration is given to Alabama residents.

GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL SCHOLARSHIPS

First-year students who are accepted for admission by mid-January and complete the scholarship application in the Auburn University Scholarship Opportunity Manager (AUSOM) by February 1 receive consideration. **A scholarship application is required.**
