## **DATES AND DEADLINES**

**AUGUST 1** 



Admission application available.

**DECEMBER 1** 



Final Early Action deadline. Complete application due for scholarship consideration. SEPTEMBER 15



First Early Action deadline. Decision to be released mid-October.

**JANUARY 10** 



Test score deadline for scholarship consideration. Updated test scores for firstyear students must be received by Auburn. OCTOBER 1



Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) available.

**FEBRUARY 1** 



Last day to apply for admission and scholarships, FAFSA deadline. **OCTOBER 15** 



Second Early Action deadline. Decisions to be released mid-November.

MARCH 1



Financial Aid priority deadline. **NOVEMBER 1** 



Scholarship application available through AUSOM.

MAY 1



Enrollment deposit deadline. Deadline to accept or decline scholarship offers.

# **APPLICATION AT A GLANCE**

#### **TEST-OPTIONAL POLICY**

Auburn offers a Test-Optional policy which gives applicants the choice to submit test scores for consideration. Here is a helpful chart that breaks down the requirements for admissions and scholarship consideration for a Traditional Applicant and a Test-Optional Applicant.

## **SCHOLARSHIP TYPES**

## **AUTOMATIC CONSIDERATION**

#### COMPETITIVE MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS

First-year students who are accepted for admission by mid-January receive automatic consideration. A scholarship application is not required. However, applicants must submit test scores to be considered.

#### SELECT NEED-BASED SCHOLARSHIPS

First-year students who are accepted for admission by mid-January and have a **completed** Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) received by Auburn by February 1 receive automatic consideration. A scholarship application is not required.

### REQUIRED SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

#### ACHIEVEMENT AND LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIPS

May be awarded as funding permits and are renewable for four years. Consideration is based on high school GPA and information provided on the scholarship application. For traditional applicants, standardized test score may also be considered. For test-optional applicants, the academic assessment during the evaluation for admission may also be considered. Priority consideration is given to Alabama residents.

#### GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL SCHOLARSHIPS

First-year students who are accepted for admission by mid-January and complete the scholarship application in the Auburn University Scholarship Opportunity Manager (AUSOM) by February 1 receive consideration. A scholarship application is required.
